
Declaration of RoHS Compliance

The EU Directive 2011/65/EU, which refers to “Restriction of Hazardous Substances” or “RoHS”, is made by the European Union (EU) and took effect on 1 July 2011. This restricts the use of the following six hazardous substances in the manufactures of various types of the electrical and electronic devices:


- Lead (Pb) < 1000 ppm
- Mercury (Hg) < 1000 ppm
- Cadmium (Cd) < 100 ppm
- Hexavalent Chromium (Cr+6) < 1000 ppm
- PolyBrominated Biphenyl (PBB) < 1000 ppm
- PolyBrominated Diphenyl Ether (PBDEs)(including Deca-BDE) < 1000 ppm

Exemption:

- Lead as an alloying element in steel for machining purposes and in galvanized steel containing up to 0,35 % lead by weight
- Lead as an alloying element in aluminium containing up to 0,4 % lead by weight
- Copper alloy containing up to 4 % lead by weight
- Lead in high melting temperature type solders (i.e. lead-based alloys containing 85 % by weight or more lead)
- Electrical and electronic components containing lead in a glass or ceramic other than dielectric ceramic in capacitors, e.g. piezoelectronic devices, or in a glass or ceramic matrix compound
- Lead in dielectric ceramic in capacitors for a rated voltage of 125 V AC or 250 V DC or higher
