Declaration of RoHS Compliance

- 7(c)-1: Electrical and electronic components containing lead in a glass or ceramic other than dielectric ceramic in capacitors, e.g. piezoelectronic devices, or in a glass or ceramic matrix compound
- 15: Lead in solders to complete a viable electrical connection between semiconductor die and carrier within integrated circuit flip chip packages
